

Mrs. Jan Tucker Scully '79

Valuable Alumni Award



Jan Tucker Scully has had a significant influence on her alma mater, where she earned the BFA in 1979 and the MBA in 1981. The daughter of two TCU alumni — Chancellor Emeritus William E. Tucker and Mrs. Jean Jones Tucker '56 '56 — she has been a lifelong Horned Frog. In her hometown of Fort Worth, she is a committed and busy community leader.

Mrs. Scully's influence upon the Alumni Association has been significant. She was a member of the National Alumni Board and the Fort Worth Chapter Alumni Board before serving as president of the TCU Alumni Association from 2010 to 2012. She also represented the association as a member of the TCU Board of Trustees. She has been class reunion chair and a member of *The Campaign for TCU* steering committee. Mrs. Scully is a Centurion of the Addison & Randolph Clark Society and a member of the Chancellor's Council.

Mrs. Scully was a TCU cheerleader and has remained passionate about Horned Frog athletics, particularly football. Fittingly, during her Alumni Association presidency, TCU experienced two of the most significant events in its history: the 2010 College World Series and the 2011 Rose Bowl. During the College World Series, nearly 1,000 Frog Fans enjoyed eight Alumni Association events in Omaha. Some 2,200 Frog Fans traveled with the Alumni Association to the Rose Bowl, requiring six hotels, eight charters and 52 game-day buses.

Mrs. Scully's impact on the community is also notable. She chaired the 2012 Jewel Charity Ball, Fort Worth's largest black-tie gala, and is the 2013 co-chairman of the All Church Home fund-raising event. A sustaining member and advisor to the Junior League of Fort Worth, she additionally serves on the Women's Health Council at Baylor All Saints Medical Center.

The Scully family is purple through and through. Mrs. Scully and her husband, Bob '81, have two Horned Frog daughters: Kate Scully Wells '08 and Amanda Scully '11.
